SUBJECT: Procedure for Chronic Disease EFFECTIVE DATE: October 2007

PURPOSE

To provide guidelines for the treatment of chronic diseases.

POLICY

Patients with certain chronic diseases (e.g., seizures, heart disease, diabetes, hypertension, TB, HIV and chronic obstructive pulmonary disease), require supervision and follow-up by the facility nurse and the facility physician. The frequency and intensity of supervision and follow-up will depend on level of acuity and stability.

PROCEDURE

TREATMENT PLAN

It shall be the responsibility of the facility provider to follow the established chronic disease guidelines in developing a treatment plan for each patient. Providers may augment the established treatment plan within department policy, but the guidelines must be followed as an established minimum. In the absence of another treatment plan, the current chronic disease guideline will be followed as the applicable plan as the inmate patient transfers from unit to unit.

The treatment plan will include direction to the nursing staff regarding their responsibilities in the care and supervision of these patients. Standing orders for baseline diagnostic and regular follow ups will be completed by the nurse according to policy TX II-3.

It shall be the responsibility of the provider to establish treatment plans for those disease processes that do not have department established guidelines. This should include instructions to nurses regarding their responsibility for care and follow up. Treatment plan initiation and follow up shall be documented appropriately in the medical record by all providers.

HOUSING OF SPECIAL NEEDS PATIENTS

In consideration of the Americans with Disabilities Act or when it has been determined by appropriate medical staff that an inmate requires special safeguards not available at every facility, an appropriate facility with such safeguards as are needed will be determined and an inmate will be assigned to that facility.
