





RE: Inmate Medical Cost Containment Report

Pursuant to Section 18.10 of Session Law 2011-145, the Department of Public Safety is required to report on:

- (1) The volume of services provided by community medical providers that can be scheduled in advance and, of that volume, the percentage of those services that are provided by contracted providers; and
- (2) The volume of services provided by community medical providers that cannot be scheduled in advance and, of that volume, the percentage of those services that are provided by contracted providers.

This report is for hospitalizations of inmates which occurred from January 1, 2012 to March 31, 2012.

During this time period, there were 440 hospital admissions. Of these 440 admissions, 86% (378) were emergent and 14% (62) were scheduled. Among these 378 emergent admissions, 51% (192) were to contracted hospitals and 49% (186) were to non-contracted hospitals. Regarding the 62 scheduled admissions, 65% (40) were to contracted hospitals while 35% (22) were to non-contracted facilities. Overall during this period, 53% (232) of admissions went to contracted facilities while the remaining 47% (208) went to non-contracted facilities.

Figure 1 below shows the distribution of hospital admissions in contracted and non-contracted facilities from January 1, 2012 through March 31, 2012. Figure 2 below shows the distribution of the emergent and scheduled hospital admissions from January 1, 2012 through March 31, 2012. (These figures are based on data currently available which may be updated after submission of this report.)
